#### Dear Padre.

#### When and where did perpetual adoration develop?

Adoration of the Eucharist can be traced to the early centuries of Christianity, but the practice of perpetually adoring the Eucharist began most clearly in Europe after the Council of Trent (1545–1563).

An Austrian community of cloistered Benedictine nuns took vows of perpetual adoration in the seventeenth century. As the number of cloistered communities dedicated to perpetual adoration grew, the need arose to bring this devotion to the laity. By the nineteenth century, various practices of adoration of the Eucharist were established.

By the mid-nineteenth century, French Saint Pierre-Julien Eymard started the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament for men to instill in the lay faithful the desire to honor and worship Christ in the Eucharist. Saint Pierre-Julien built churches dedicated to perpetual adoration and inspired many to make a holy hour in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

By the mid-twentieth century, the practice of perpetual adoration began to fade. With the renewal of the liturgy and the accent on the baptismal priesthood's role of justice in the modern world, many types of devotions waned, including devotion to visiting the Blessed Sacrament.

Saint John Paul II, however, revised the practice of perpetual adoration, and today parishes throughout the United States have special chapels in which parishioners are encouraged to spend at least one hour a week in adoration. Pious societies promote perpetual adoration as a way of giving praise and thanks to Christ.

#### Halloween & the Irish

Did one ever think where Halloween customs came from? Well they came from the Celts back in the 4<sup>th</sup> century.

<u>Dressing in Costume</u>: Even though Christianized by the likes of St. Canicus, Kieran, and Columban (and other Irish monks), on Halloween the Celts believed that the spirits and ghosts of the dead came back to

roam the earth.
People wore
masks and
"dressed up" in an



outfit to look like one of the spirits to avoid being recognized as one of the living.

<u>Jack-O-Lanterns</u>: On the Emerald Island lived a miserable man named Jack who tricked the devil. Unable to enter heaven or hell after death, he was destined to roam the earth listlessly.

Jack placed a burning ember of coal in a carved out turnip and used it as a lantern to keep evil spirits away. When the Irish migrated to America, turnips were replaced with pumpkins.

<u>Trick or Treating:</u> In preparation for All Hallows Eve (the Feast of All Saints), the poor would call upon the rich folks and request money, gifts, and food. The food was gathered for a huge, communal feast of the poor.

When St. Patrick came upon the scene in the 5<sup>th</sup> century, he helped to dissolve more fully the pagan significance of Halloween, but the fun persisted even coming across the Atlantic Ocean to America.


