Dear Padre,

A neighboring parish has eliminated the exchange of peace and sharing of the cup at Mass during flu season. Should our parish be concerned, too?

The flu is contagious about twenty-four hours before symptoms develop, so churches make prudent decisions to help prevent its transmission. Should your parish be concerned? Yes. Panicked? No. Some churches take precautions to mitigate the spread of germs—such as bowing toward one another instead of shaking hands at the exchange of peace—but the risk of contracting an illness by taking one sip from a communion vessel is low. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, there's a risk, but it is so small, it's barely detectable. The wine's alcohol content in a chalice made of precious metal helps minimize the risk. Communicants can further diminish this risk by refraining from the cup when they're sick with a respiratory infection or suffer from a compromised immune system. Ministers should do their part by wiping the chalice rim thoroughly with the purificator and rotating it after each communicant. It's advisable to use a clean cloth at every Mass, and the cup is best washed with soap and hot water before storing.

The Church teaches that Christ, whole and entire, is received even under only one species (*General Instruction of the Roman Missal, 282*). While drinking from the cup is an option, not an imposition, "Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it takes place under both kinds" (*GIRM 281*). Veterans Day

Veterans Day **f**alls on the second Monday in November this year. The federal holiday is celebrated every year on Nov. 11, regardless of the day of the week on which it falls. First recognized as Armistice Day in 1919, Veterans Day marks the date when Germany and the allies signed a 1918 agreement to cease World War I hostilities. The fighting ceased on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed Nov. 11 as the first commemoration of Armistice Day, saying: "To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory."

We salute those in our parishes who have served us to keep our great nation and us free. Naturally our greatest freedom is to be with God in Heaven – free from all anxiety, fear, and illness. Our Veterans provided us with the freedom of living in the greatest country in the world.

Opening of the Mass Book for 2020

On Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, 11/12-13-14 from 10am-12 noon, 1pm-3pm, the parish's Mass Intention Book will be opened to the parishioners to request Masses for the next year. Some guidelines are set forth below to maintain a sense of fairness since there are frequently more Mass intentions to be requested than we have dates for Masses. We will try to honor your requests; but please remember the size of the parish and other parishioners' desires to also schedule Masses for their loved ones. A pastor may only accept enough Masses to be said in one year. (We currently have a backlog of Masses to be said). A pastor is required to say one Mass monthly for the living and deceased of the parish. (We are trying to fulfill this obligation with Masses on Christmas, Easter, and **First Saturdays**).

- 1. Due to the large volume of requested Masses each year, we will only accept two (2) of the same intention for the year. We would recommend that if you have a large family, that you would consider making it a family intention as opposed for each individual member of your family.
- 2. Mass Intention requests for Saturdays and Sundays are the most requested day. This must be first come, first served. <u>However, if</u> you wish a Mass offered on a weekend, family members or their designees must bring up the offertory gifts.
- 3. Our pastor will do his very best to honor the requested dates for scheduled Masses. However, there might arise times where Masses need to be rescheduled to a later date or time. Your understanding in regards to this matter is sought.
- 4. Once the Mass Book is closed, no other intentions will be accepted. This is to assure that unsaid Masses from previous years are offered in proper fashion and to attempt to allow Mass being offered for someone who dies recently.
- 5. For deaths that occur within the course of the year, in addition to the funeral Mass, the pastor at his discretion will make every effort to provide another scheduled Mass for the recently deceased. Once again this might not always be possible because of the number of deaths that occur that year and to offer back Masses.
- 6. Mass Cards issued during the course of the year will not be given a celebration date. For instance, if John Doe passes away and 30 people request a Mass Card, the schedule will not allow 30 Masses to be said for John Doe in that given year.

This policy has been written with the fairness of all our parishioners in mind. It is the fact that a Mass is being offered for someone that is more important than when it is celebrated. For your loved one, every day in Heaven is their birthday, or Christmas, or the day of their being with God. Your cooperation will be deeply appreciated.
