Dear Padre,

An intellectual friend told me that she loves the great dogmas of Advent. I smiled and agreed, but I don't have the faintest idea what she meant!

Dogma refers to Church teachings defined by an ecumenical council, including the pope, or by the pope alone acting as head of the Church. The magisterium, the Church's teaching authority, tells us these must-be-believed truths have been divinely revealed to us. During Advent, we celebrate two dogmas: the immaculate conception of Mary, which we honor tomorrow, and the Incarnation, which includes the birth of Christ that we prepare for now.

Both dogmas speak of God's extraordinary connection with humanity. God specially gifted Mary because of her role in becoming the Mother of God. Mary, from the instant of her conception, was free from original sin. Her closeness to Jesus was established from the earliest moments of her existence.

The dogma of the Incarnation is defined simply by St. John. "The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us" (John 1:14). During the year, we first celebrate the Incarnation on March 25, at the solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord. Scripture and Tradition hold that Jesus was conceived in Mary's womb when she accepted God's will by answering yes to the angel's announcement that she would bear the "Son of the Most High" (Luke 1:32). During Advent, we eagerly anticipate the result of that Incarnation, Jesus' birth.

Dogmas can sometimes seem disconnected from our lives. The customs of Advent put an everyday face on the book definitions and remind us that God lives in our midst.

Got Oplatki?

Oplatki are thin wafers of unleaven bread baked between two plates engraved with Nativity scenes. Derived from a Latin word meaning 'sacred bread,' the sharing of oplatki with family before Christmas Eve dinner is a non-sacramental foreshadowing of the sacramental Eucharistic meal to follow with the family attending Christmas Mass.

The message behind this Polish custom is one of love and family unity.

CHRISTMAS CATHOLIC NEWS POPE RETURNS RELIC OF JESUS' CRIB TO HOLY LAND

Pope Francis gave a small fragment of Jesus' crib back to Catholics in the Holy Land. Experts from the Vatican Museums extracted a small fragment from the relic of what has been venerated as Jesus' manger. The relic, given to the Vatican in the seventh century, has been kept in a chapel under the basilica's main altar. Pope Francis gave the relic fragment to the Franciscan Custody of the Holy Land, which oversees the churches and shrines associated with the birth, death and resurrection of Jesus.

IN LETTER, POPE ASKS CATHOLICS TO SET UP NATIVITY SET

A Nativity scene is a simple reminder of something astonishing: God became human to reveal the greatness of his love "by smiling and opening his arms to all," Pope Francis said in a letter on the meaning and importance of setting up Christmas cribs. "The Christmas creche speaks to us of the love of God," the pope wrote in his letter, signed in Grecio, Italy, where St. Francis of Assisi set up the first Nativity scene in 1223.

NEW CHRISTMAS MOVIE IS RELEASED ON DVD

"Buttons: A Christmas Tale," was released on DVD December 3, just in time for the Christmas holidays. The musical film tells the interconnected stories of two orphans who overcome heartbreak and adversity at Christmas time, thanks to the watchful care and timely help of a pair of guardian angels, played by Hollywood legends Dick Van Dyke and Angela Lansbury.
